Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to the new school year! We hope that you and your family have had a rejuvenating year-end holiday together.

2025 is a special year for our Xinmin community as we celebrate our 80th anniversary! The theme for this milestone is **Decades of Dedication :: Shaping Future Generations (**依水思源 :: 继往开来). The double colon is a mathematical symbol representing equal importance – we are grateful to many generations of educators, students, and stakeholders for their decades of dedication in bringing our school to where we are today, and we are committed to carrying this spirit of excellence to continue shaping future generations – including your child/ward – for our nation for many more years to come.

Our Xinmin community can look forward to several activities to commemorate this milestone together, including **our 80th Anniversary dinner on Saturday 1 November 2025** where past and present students, staff, and parents are welcome. Save this date, and we will share more details when ready.

This letter outlines the key areas to note as we get ready to start the new school year.

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Start of School Matters

(a) First Week of School (2 January 2025 to 10 January 2025)

The new 2025 school year will begin on Thursday 2 January 2025.

Morning assembly continues to be at 7.30am every school day (except Thursdays). To enable students to frame their minds and prepare themselves to learn in the day ahead, students should be at the respective morning assembly venues by 7.25am.

As many CCAs have sessions on Wednesdays, our school designates Thursdays as late start days. Hence, morning assembly will be at 8.30am for all students on Thursdays, with students expected to be at their form classroom by 8.25am.

As the first day of school falls on a Thursday, all students will report to the Parade Square for morning assembly at 8.25am.

To support our students in starting the new school year well, we have designed a Back-to-School Programme (BTS) in the first week with different activities for each cohort. Kindly refer to the Parents Gateway (PG) message from the Year Head team for your child's/ward's cohort for more details.

If your child/ward has fever and/or flu-like symptoms, please consult a doctor. Your child/ward should refrain from being in school until he/she has fully recovered. Please contact the school via email at <u>xinminss_email@schools.gov.sg</u> or call 6288 9382 if your child/ward is unwell and unable to be in school.

(b) School's Academic Calendar and Schoolwide Protected Time

The school's academic calendar is accessible via <u>https://go.gov.sg/xmscalendar</u>. This is also on our website under the "Resources for Students and Parents" section. It is regularly updated with the latest schedule of school events and programmes.

In particular, from the <u>MOE calendar</u>, while the last day of lessons is Friday 24 October, year-end school holidays begin on Saturday 22 November. Between these dates, secondary schools continue to have activities such as CCAs, supplementary lessons, Open House, and overseas trips which your child/ward may be involved in. Hence, **you may wish to plan the year-end holiday from Saturday 22 November**.

To ensure the well-being of students and staff, from 2025, while there will still be some activities during parts of the school holidays, there will be **schoolwide protected time where no activities should take place** (except those approved by school management, such as national-level competitions):

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(c) Timetable

The school timetable can be accessed via our school website under the "Resources for Students and Parents" section **from Thursday 9 January 2025**, with lessons starting from Monday 13 January 2025 (Term 1 Week 2). Similarly, the timetables for the respective classes can be accessed via <u>https://go.gov.sg/xmstimetable</u>. Students and parents/guardians are advised to check the timetables for planning of their schedules.

(d) Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days

Starting in 2025, Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days will follow the schedule outlined below, instead of being fixed on Thursdays. This approach aims to provide greater flexibility in scheduling and optimising curriculum time.

Students are reminded that homework assigned for/during HBL Days must be completed, just like homework assigned for/during face-to-face school days. Defaulting on HBL Day homework is in non-compliance with the school's homework policy, and will be subjected to disciplinary consequences.

(e) Updated Rules on Digital Device Usage in Schools

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With increasing evidence on the negative impact of digital device usage on youth mental well-being (e.g. <u>about one in two Singaporean youth has problematic</u> <u>smartphone use</u>; <u>more teens getting hooked on digital devices and seeking help</u>), there are ongoing reviews of measures at the <u>societal level</u> and in <u>schools</u>.

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Currently, our school already requires students to lock their mobile phones in student lockers <u>during all lessons</u>, unless specific permission from school staff is given (e.g. for teaching and learning purposes).

As shared with students before the end of the 2024 school year, from 2025, **to promote balanced screen use amongst students in school**, mobile phones must be locked in students' own lockers during all lessons <u>and from 7.25am (or 8.25am on Thursdays) to at least 11.40am</u>. Usage within the school compound will not be allowed during the aforementioned periods, <u>including during recess and free periods</u>. Existing consequences for unauthorised possession and/or misuse of digital devices, such as confiscation and demerit points, will apply for non-compliance.

As good digital habits need to be instilled both at home and in school, we look forward to continuing to partner you in guiding your child/ward to be safe and responsible users of digital devices. We recommend resources such as <u>Health Hub's article</u> and <u>MOE's</u> <u>Parent Kit</u> for your reference.

(f) Student Insurance Coverage

MOE requires schools to cover their students with the basic Student Protection plan from NTUC Income. The coverage extends to all school and CCA-related activities and is with immediate effect from January to December. The cost of this insurance plan is fully borne by the school.

(g) Student Concession Pass (for Sec 1 Students Only)

All Sec 1 students will be issued with a new secondary level School Smart Card (SSC). While waiting for their secondary level SSCs to be ready, Sec 1 students can continue to use their primary level SSCs for concessionary travel till end-April 2025. Students can still purchase the Bus Concession Pass (BCP) using their primary level SSCs, but they would need to purchase the BCP for secondary school students.

Let's Recognise Our Teachers!

(a) President's Award for Teachers (PAT) and Outstanding Youth Award in Education (OYEA) 2025

Every year, two categories of national awards are given out to teachers in Singapore to recognise their professional excellence. They are the PAT and the OYEA.

The **PAT** gives national recognition to experienced teachers who are role models for the teaching profession. These teachers personify deep passion for teaching, and inspire both their students and peers through their words and deeds.

The **OYEA** gives national recognition to young teachers who are role models for the teaching profession. These teachers personify youthful idealism, energy and enthusiasm, and inspire both their students and peers through their words and deeds. Educators who are 35 years and younger are eligible for the award. Hence, OYEA 2025 is open to educators who are born on or after 30 June 1990.

Nominations are now open and will close on Friday 10 January 2025.
